

Worst bilateral relations in the 5th republic with Iran (since 1958)

Foreign policy principles

- 1. Freedom, equality, brotherhood
- 2. National governance and integrity (inseparable republic)
- 3. Laic republic
- 4. Democratic republic
- 5. Social republic



Driving forces in foreign policy

- Rejecting the American-oriented era for the west and seeking for a multi-lateral order (Gaullism)
- Strategic independence:
- 1. France position in the international arena
- 2. Keeping international network and investment in French language
- 3. Insisting on its permanent membership in UNSC
- 4. Expanding and renewal of the military forces in French, European and global domains
- 5. Contribute in Global Strategy of European Union security program
- 6. Implementing military act in European Union framework
- 7. Following "influence diplomacy" to fulfill strategic independence
- 8. French peace measures to expand French influence and fulfill strategic independence


