1908: D'Arcy 16% of the final margin 52.5% of management power, Veto right









- 24 Mton/year production
- 200 tanker/month
- 300 iner-ocean tankers worldwide
- Side-refinery in Kermanshah





American capitals in Iran:


- 1. Embassy itself and diplomatic presence
- 2. Point 4 network
- 3. Presence in Iranian Army and air force
- 4. Civil presence (more than 1000 Americans in Tehran

Reasons: British point of view

- 1. Mosaddegh defiance to accept the oil deal
- 2. Cash flow of the administration
- 3. Emotional policies of Mosaddegh
- 4. Proliferation of his power in spite of the constitutional law
- 5. Weakening the Shah and the Army
- 6. Cooperation with Tudeh party


